Details about submitting your proposed topics:

Evaluation Criteria for Submissions:

1. **Relevance of Proposed Topic to Our 2019 Theme:** Topic is relevant to the theme of the conference - *Technology in Service of People*. We are looking for topics that address the practical applications of digital organization design work.
2. **“Draw” of Specific Topic:** Specific content that is likely to be of high interest to participants - appealing to a diverse, global audience and offering case studies of recent organization design projects that could be relevant to global organizations of all types and sizes.
3. **Direct, small group interaction:** Station presenters have a chance to share thoughts in a more intimate, supportive setting rather than a larger, anonymous setting. For participants, it is a chance to interact directly in a small group mode with several different presenters, to compare and contrast the approaches, and to challenge the ideas being presented for a better understanding.
4. **Presenters’ Experience** regarding the practice of real-world organization design model/case study. We encourage submissions from presenters with various levels of experience.

Benefits of Presenting:

- An opportunity to influence representatives from major corporations and organizations who are very supportive of organization design and influence the design-related decisions their organizations make.
- The opportunity for exposure to an audience of global organization designers.
- An opportunity for peer review of new organization design methodologies, processes, and tools.
- Authors can sell their books and resources throughout the conference via ODF’s administrator.
- Work with an assigned coach who will assist you in tailoring your presentation to ensure a successful outcome at the conference, making it a win-win for the presenter and the audience.

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Conference Presenters / Workshop Leaders Agreement:

Conference Design: The selected Poster Sessions will be held the afternoon of April 17th as part of a Gallery Walk format, a technique that gets participants out of their chairs, away from the .ppt presentations and into a mode of active engagement. Gallery station presenters are given the chance to share their design work in a more intimate, supportive setting rather than a larger, anonymous setting. For participants it's a chance to interact directly in a small group mode with several different presenters and to compare and contrast the approaches or features of the design model/case study and to challenge/better understand the ideas being presented.

The Gallery Walk will be ~90 minutes in length. Preferred sessions will highlight a focus on digital operating models. Groups will rotate to each presenter's station for fifteen-minute sessions.

A group debrief will occur once the four rotations have been completed.

Coaching Agreement: Presenters agree to work with an assigned conference coach who will advise on the design of your experience so it integrates into the theme and flow of the conference, as well as assisting in ensuring that the engagement/presentation methodology is interactive.

Knowledge Sharing: It is intended that every conference session will be aimed at advancing the skills, knowledge, and tools of practitioners. It is our hope that out of this session participants will walk away with an understanding of applied features of various digital organization designs. Presenters also agree to refrain from including any sales messages in their presentations.

Equipment: A template is provided for your poster layout to be used as a visual look in to your session. ODF will be responsible for having these posters printed and on display at the conference. The presenter agrees to have the required content ready for printing allowing adequate time for printing. We will also provide a flip chart and assign a scribe for capturing any key implications and/or remaining questions visible at the station.

Marketing: Presenters are encouraged to start a conversation within ODF's LinkedIn Group, Twitter, and the Conference App (as we get closer to the conference dates) and to participate in conversation threads encouraging interest in their presentation, and in the conference.

Conference Participation: Presenters are encouraged to attend and participate in the entire three-day conference as both a collaborator in knowledge-sharing and a participant.
